



CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

The Sunday school program currently provides Christian education classes for children ages 4 to 12. In 2017, Donna Maybee, with the occasional assistance of Sydney Allen. We are always trying to come up with fun ways to remember what God is trying to teach us from the bible. We use flash cards created by Deb Brown with the spiritual gifts to play games as a way to remind us that God gave each of us gifts to be used for His purpose. Which ones do you have? Earlier the kids did a test to find out which ones they most likely already have. Ask them what the results were. Regular attendance varied from 2 to 10 children.

On Easter Sunday, the Coffee and Chat group presented Neillia Bassett and C. C. Craig with monetary gifts to aid them financially so they could attend Quin-Mo-Lac Camp. After the presentation, all the children came to the front to sing "Everybody Ought to Know" under the direction of Beverly Dafoe.

The International Directors, Tom & Cheryl Martin, joined the congregation for the Mother's Day Service. On June 11, 2005, they had established Helping Cope Through Hope, a non-profit, non-partisan, voluntary Christian Outreach Organization that spreads to countries of Peru, Uganda and Zambia. Helping C.O.P.E. (Children, Orphans, Poor & Prisoners Exploited) through H.O.P.E. (Healing, Orphanages, Provisions, Education.)

Tom & Cheryl have taught classes and worked with children and the poor for the last 3 years. They have lived in orphanages so they have seen first hand the great need. Their ministry buys food and clothes for the poor, buys bicycles, pays school fees, holds literacy and health classes and much more. Our Sunday school was able to send a substantial amount of donations with them by filling a 200 lb bag with school and hygiene supplies. These items were distributed by Tom and Cheryl once they travelled to meet with the sponsored children. We saw a few more children sponsored through our congregation and hope to change lives by showing our love and concern to these children.

Everyone thoroughly enjoyed the children's participation in the White Gift service. Under the direction of **Donna Maybee**, the children presented creation as it is written in Genesis 1:1. We used puzzle cards to present what **God** created each day. We discovered that Jesus was present at the beginning of creation! **Donna** also explained that in Sunday School, the children were making up "**Shoe boxes**" to be sent to children in need. During the offering, the children gladly collected all of the White Gifts that the congregation had brought. Steve and Beverly Dafoe delivered the gifts to the Three Oaks Foundation Women's shelter along with a cheque for \$376.00, which was gratefully received.

The Sunday school sponsors a little boy from Nicaragua, Vicente Gabriel Nolasco Vilchez and send him monetary support on a quarterly basis of \$117.00 through the Christian Children's Fund of Canada. At Christmas time, we sent an extra \$25.00 as a Christmas gift. Our support makes a great difference in the lives of children, families and communities in developing countries.

REMITS: Shaping the Future or Our Church

"The need for change in how the church is and will be united in God's work is pressing. This is not just about money or about structural change, but about vitality in the church."

When The United Church of Canada was formed in 1925, major changes in its structure could be made <u>only</u> through consulting with all local churches. There are major changes ahead for The United Church of Canada. General Council in 2015 developed five remits for vote by all presbyteries and churches in 2017/2018.

Remit 1: Three-Council Model (eliminates presbyteries/conferences, creates regions

Remit 2: Elimination of Transfer & Settlement

Remit 3: Office of Vocation (discipline of ministers to be at the national level)

Remit 4: Funding a New Model (changes the way we fund our national church)

Remit 6: One Order of Ministry (for Ordained, Diaconal & Designated Lay Ministers) The Emmanuel, the Official Board set up a task team consisting of ministry personnel (Rev Bob Matheson, Rev Bob Flindall, & Rev Charles Hainer), presbytery rep (Cheryl Mound) & Official Board secretary (Bev Dafoe.) The team prepared information for the Board which voted 'yes' to remit 2, 'no' remits 1, 3, 4 and 'no' (via no vote) on remit 6. Remits 1 to 5 passed nation-wide and go to the 43rd General Council 2018 for final approval of implementation. National Remit 6 results will be available after February.

Presbytery Representative Annual Report – 2017 Submitted by Cheryl Mound

I attended 7 of the 9 Kente Presbytery meetings, the Ministry Vocations Committee, and the three-day Conference Annual Meeting. Emmanuel hosted the May and November meetings of presbytery.

<u>Ministry Vocations</u>: As part of my duties, I continued to coordinate the Licensed Lay Worship Leaders course to be completed December 2018 and assisted with a workshop for lay people across the area.

<u>Pastoral Relations:</u> continued to be a major area with most churches in the presbytery in transition at some time during the year or relying on retired supply minister appointments. This meant assisting with JNACS, visioning or search committees as well as overseeing appointments and covenanting calls.

Church in Community: Presbytery meetings have included program on mission work of the church. I attended a vigil in Belleville market square, in solidarity with the victims of a shooting in a Montreal mosque and was proud to see the support of United and other churches and local dignitaries. Program also included information about Fair Trade to reduce exploitation of workers and child labour. We have also supported a bill in parliament for Canada to adopt the principles of the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples. Care of the planet has been a topic of discussion and a film presentation to presbytery members.

Administration & Web-page: the Kente Presbytery web-page continues to be active and is updated monthly; all churches are welcome to send in event notices.

Conference Annual Meeting: was held this year in Brockville where I served as a steward this year. Discussion including remits to re-structure the church. Although our church and presbytery did not support all of them, all four passed nationally. Therefore. Major changes are expected after the July General Council meeting in Oshawa.

Youth: With Jackie Harper's retirement, Cathy Russel took on this busy Conference portfolio. Each year about 40 young people gather at CAM, an excellent overnight youth event is held each fall in Belleville, and other smaller events occur during the year. We continue to support Christian Camping at Quin-Mo-Lac, Golden Lake and Camp Lau-ren.

Kente presbytery has a "Training and Transition fund" set up with money from the sale of Front Road church that is available up to the end of 2018 for any local church initiative designed to grow and broaden the mission of that church. Some churches have used these funds for speakers for community outreach groups (similar to our Coffee and Chat events of recent years) and an electric piano to further an open door music series. Information about that fund has been provided to the Board of Emmanuel.

The connection with others in neighbouring churches is something I have highly valued as your presbytery rep, and I hope that information provided to the church has been of value to the faith community.

Communications Support

2017 has been a very busy year for me at Emmanuel United Church. Following is a list of some of the tasks I have completed:

- Design and print bulletin covers as needed and funeral, wedding and baptism bulletin covers when requested.
- ➤ Designed the front and back covers for the 2017 Annual Report.
- Assist Beverly Dafoe weekly by assembling the bulletins, preparing children's bulletins and finding pictures for the Sunday School children to colour.
- Provided inserts for the plastic table holders for various dinners and functions.
- Continue to provide pew cards and special envelopes for offerings
 e.g. Anniversary, Visitors, and White Gift.
- Email event announcements to local newspapers, radio, Kente Presbytery and local churches.
- Media coverage, posters and tickets for the Auction and some of the dinners/functions not presented by the UCW.
- At the request of Donna Maybee, I printed up book markers with each child's name on it and what they wanted help with in prayers.
- Made up and laminated spiritual flash cards and helped with the visuals for the Creation Story presentation.
- Compile, print and deliver to the Stewards for distribution a Coming Events Newsletter two times a year.

COMMITTEE OF STEWARDS REPORT

We appreciate the thousands of hours of volunteer work of our church members and the support of people and businesses in the community who have done so much this year for our church life. It costs over \$12,000 a month to keep the church operating at our present level. Most of this money comes from offerings and fundraising. (The offerings cover almost half of the money required most months.) At the last Annual Meeting, the use of \$39,724 from investments was passed to cover shortfalls in 2017. We needed to use \$30,000 of these investments to help cover our costs this year.

In 2017, our major expenses included painting choir room walls and ceiling, re-wired the lights in the Sunday School room, installed motion sensor lights on front sidewalk and outside kitchen door, installed a new closure on hall door and the major expense was buying, clearing and re-surfacing the back parking lot. Our regular bills include hydro, telephone/internet, natural gas, custodial services, snow removal and lawn maintenance. We are continuing the repairs on the steel roof over the offices. Projects in 2018 will be to replace the church hall furnace, replace the outdoor garbage bin and drywalling the secretary's office.

Stewards manage the Emmanuel United Church Fund including memorial donations and bequests. The money that is donated to our church on behalf of loved ones goes directly into our general account to help cover church expenses. A few years ago, the Official Board approved a "Bequest Plaque" that hangs at the back of the sanctuary. This plaque lists names of past members and their spouses who have left money to the church in their wills. We would like to encourage members, also, to become PAR donors to help offset bills that occur during the holidays.

The Stewards would like to particularly thank the United Church Women who do the majority of the fund-raising in our church. This year, we had to say goodbye to Coffee & Chat group and Shelby MacPherson's Pancake Breakfast group. They will be dearly missed. We would like to extend extra thankyous to Bev Stewart, Cheryl Mound, Deb Fortin-Brown, Phyllis Brownson and Beverly Dafoe for all that they do "behind the scenes"! We would also like to take this time to thank Ed Pallo for up-dating our website foxborounitedchurch.ca/ Lastly, we thank our own committee members. They are Jim Stewart (church treasurer), Cheryl Pallo (envelope steward), Marilyn Hoard (secretary), Carolyn Dafoe (chair), Steve Dafoe, Brian Anderson, Donna Kennedy, Bill Hoard, Colleen Murray, Janis Bradshaw-Ethier and Murney Bradshaw for their decision making, maintenance, mail delivery, counting on Sundays, etc.

As always, we look forward in the years ahead to continued stewardship and service for the life and work of Emmanuel United Church.

ENVELOPE STEWARD

The year 2017 saw total Sunday Offerings increase by approximately \$700 from 2016. (It should be noted that \$4,250 of this year's total offering was received as Gifts in Kind).

Of the 64 issued Envelope/PAR numbers in 2017, 59 contributed; down from the 61 who contributed in 2016.

Of those 59 Envelope/Par contributors, the proportion of givings shifted slightly with an increase in those contributing over \$1,000:

There were two fewer PAR contributors this year. PAR is a service to members who prefer monthly bank debits for offerings and to help the church and its members avoid large fluctuations in contributions.

This year we have exceeded our covenant made with the United Church of Canada. Steady Sunday envelope and PAR donations continued to add to our final total and extra generous contributions by a few of our members helped us meet our 2017 commitment. We were able to forward \$7,000.47 (including interest) to the National Office for Mission & Service in 2017, surpassing our commitment by a small margin. As usual, the United Church Women continue to meet their committed goal.

Although they are not actually Mission and Service projects, our members continue to donate money and gifts to the Three Oaks Foundation Womens' Shelter through our annual White Gift Service and they give generously to our local Gleaners Food Bank and Christmas Sharing, to name a few of the charities we support locally.

The number of envelope/PAR donors to M&S has declined over the past several years. However, Emmanuel continues to have a good percentage of donors who give to M&S and we hope that more people will help support the important work of our Mission & Service teams at home and around the world.

To the Congregation of Emmanuel United Church

We conducted a review of the financial records of the Emmanuel United Church, both receipts and expenditures. This review acts as a double check on the records and ensures that all financial transactions have been properly recorded and the financial position of the Church has been properly reported. Our review of the finances involved comparison of ledger entries, bank statement entries, deposit slips and documentation of assets for the following (see next page for details of assets):

- General Account
- Memorial Account
- > Emmanuel United Church Fund
- Bible Fund
- Manse Fund
- Mission & Service Fund

We reviewed the methods of counting and recording offerings and donations. Donations were reviewed only back to envelope numbers. The Envelope Steward prepares statements quarterly and receipts within a month of the end of the taxation year.

We reviewed the method of recording and receipting of Memorial donations. Our office assistant mails a receipt along with a letter of acknowledgement as soon as possible after donations are received.

Records of the treasurer were well organized, with clear annotations to explain entries. It was a straightforward process to compare invoices and computer ledger reports with monthly bank statements which include cancelled cheques.

In our opinion, the statement reviewed accurately reflects the financial position of Emmanuel United Church as of December 31, 2017

We would like to acknowledge the major contribution of time and service of all persons involved in the financial matters pertaining to Emmanuel United Church. Thank you to all for your assistance in preparation of material for us.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES

2017 Annual Report

The Trustees for 2017 were:

Jim Stewart - chair, Beverly Dafoe - secretary, Ivan Clare, Stan Dafoe, Ralph Murray, Brian Anderson, Alvin Donaldson and Rev. Bob. I'm happy to tell you, they are all going to stay for the coming year. We worked closely with the Stewards on the items the Trustees were involved with. We held two meetings and several phone polls during the year to discuss the 2018 budget, and the parking lot. We also had two work party days to clean up around the edge of the parking lot. All necessary business has, or is being dealt with.

Following is an update on those items;

Insurance – We continue our insurance with State Farm. The premium has remained very good in relation to other companies. Even though the United Church of Canada is offering the D & O insurance free again, we are keeping it with State Farm. We have suggested a budget amount of \$ 2900 for 2018. This is down \$100 from 2017.

Monthly inspections- continued this year, finding only minor problems, like batteries and lamps that needed replacing. New motion lights were installed at the front sidewalk and the rear kitchen entrance, to make it safer for night time entry, The furnaces were inspected and serviced. The furnace that heats the hall, kitchen Sunday School and Choir rooms is beginning to show its age, we will keep a close eye on it, and replace it when needed.

Drinking water – The drinking water continues to be monitored. Water tests were done in January, April, July, August & November. The test results were all good. Jim Stewart, Beverly and Steve Dafoe are Certified Drinking Water Systems Operators.

Building issues for 2017- For 2017 we are still having issues with the metal roof and vents on the roof over the offices and choir room. Murney Bradshaw has been working with the Stewards to resolve those issues. We will monitor it over the winter and decide if more has to be done in the spring. A new door closure and key lock box were installed at the north hall entrance.

Parking lot—Beaudrie Excavating cleaned up around the edges and levelled the lot. Many loads of gravel and ground asphalt were spread and compacted to improve the surface. Keeping the edges clean will be an ongoing task.

We would like to thank **Rev. Hainer**, **Rev, Bob Flindall** and the **UCW** for looking after Sunday morning service on the occasions that Rev. Bob was unable to attend.

Hugh Johnston – We continue to enjoy Hugh's music every week, and thank him for his continued dedication because of his long commute. The M & P Committee recommended an increase for 2018 that was approved at the Official Board
